The University uses a 100-point cumulative system for assessing the learning outcomes of higher education students.

The current control is carried out during lectures, practical, laboratory and seminar classes and aims to check the level of readiness of the higher education applicant to perform specific work and is assessed by the amount of points scored: the maximum possible number of points for the current and final control during the semester - 100 and the minimum possible number of points - 60.

Current control includes the following control measures: interactive tasks by topic; current control works; presentations; individual essay writing.
